

Originally Morgan was approached to purchase the Ritz Theater by a group who intended to restore the theater with volunteer labor. He did so and that group made quick work of the demolition with greatly appreciated help from Rick Dixon and Mark Mosely and the company they were partners in at the time. Eventually the vision increased and the need for an organization to take on the project, its planning, construction and fundraising was born with Mr. Cline's help.

Exline Community Betterment Association

The organization was stimulated and is financially supported by Morgan as an entity to facilitate activities and festivals as well as to help with local community betterment and development efforts.

Coal Miners Commons

This is the most recent brain child of Cline. It is a senior community consisting of eight one bedroom replicas of the original coal mining houses that filled the community over 100 years ago. Apartments rent to seniors for only \$400 a month. They have their own new home completely fitted with new appliances including washers and dryers and dishwashers. It is surrounded by picket fence, nicely lighted and land-

scaped and less than a block from the Exline Old Country Store and Antiques Exchange and the local post office.

Morgan E. Cline Medical Plaza

A part of the Mercy Hospital and named in honor of Morgan in recognition of his contribution of \$1,000,000 to the Legacies Foundation

The Cline Family Dialysis Center

Name for the Cline Family in honor of the \$500,000 donation made to the hospital for the development of the center. Later Morgan donated funding for four additional dialysis units at the center filling it to capacity.

The Morgan E. Cline Hall of Pharmacy Science

Drake University Pharmacy College Building dedicated to and named for Morgan E. Cline in recognition of his \$5,000,000 gift to the college from which he graduated.

Morgan E. Cline Family Sports Complex

Yet to be completed, it is named in honor of Morgan Cline's leading contribution of \$120,000.

In addition, Morgan has quietly done a number of charitable things that have gone unmentioned.

His favorite effort is to purchase and have delivered with the help of the Boy Scouts, 50 food baskets filled with over \$50 worth of food staples at Christmas time.

Bill Burch, who is Cline's local representative for these multiple business enterprises and community betterment projects, is also a partner in other area endeavors. He says that on the average for the past 10 years, there has been a new project every six months.

"The last 10 years have been the best," observed Burch. "Whether individually or together, I've had the opportunity to start and/or operate 14 corporations and to participate to a significant degree in twice as many projects or active business endeavors.
