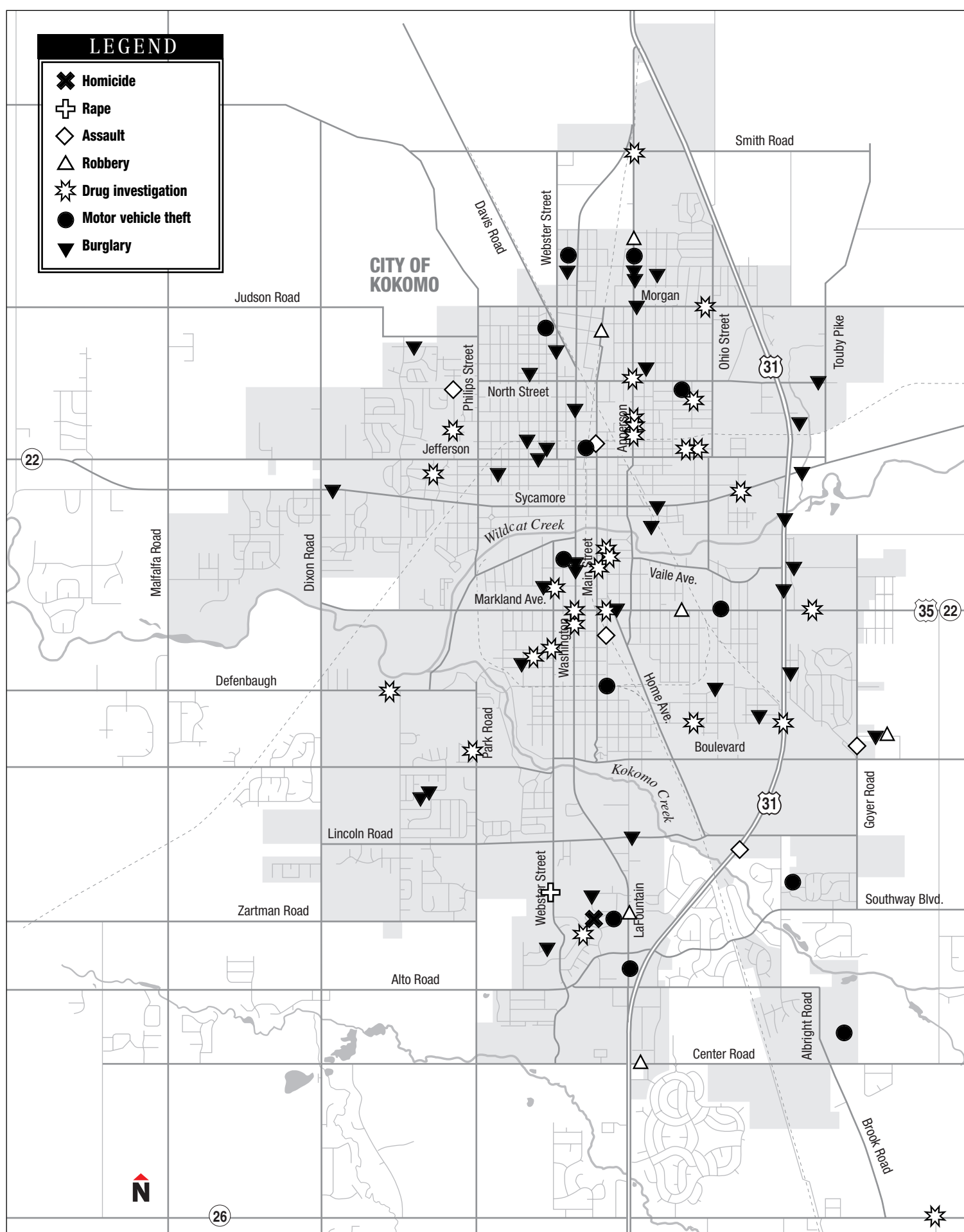

December crime falls slightly

A slight reduction in assaults and burglaries and the city's 11th homicide of 2005 prompted police action in December, Kokomo Police Department crime statistics show. The latest homicide victim, Barbara Ferguson, 45, was found dead in her living room in her Vinton Circle home on the south side, just before 2 p.m. Dec. 31. She was last seen two days before. Ferguson's daughter, who had been staying with friends, called police after finding the home's sliding glass door broken out, according to police reports. She had gone to the house after not being able to reach her mother

by phone for a few days. Police believe the suspect in Ferguson's homicide is Quincy Rogers, a neighbor of Ferguson's who was found dead of a self-inflicted gunshot wound Jan. 3 in a Las Vegas motel room near Nellis Air Force Base, Lt. Donald Whitehead said. Rogers was reported missing by his girlfriend days after the shooting. The couple reportedly lived on Vinton Circle, near Ferguson, Whitehead said. The gun Rogers used to kill himself and other evidence found in the motel room will be sent to a lab to make a positive link, Whitehead said. Along with Ferguson's homicide, police reported a drop in burglary reports, from 51 in November to 39

in December. Police also responded to two more robberies and four fewer assaults in December. The stats show police also received fewer calls of drug activity, from 36 in November to 33 in December.

AREA SENTENCINGS

- Troy Coleman, 47, Kokomo, convicted in Howard Superior Court 2 of Class B felony possession of cocaine, was sentenced to the Indiana Department of Correction for 10 years, with six years to be executed and four years suspended on supervised probation. Defendant was given credit for time served and ordered to pay court costs and a drug free community assessment fee.
- Denise R. Hudak, 20, South Bend, convicted in Howard Superior Court 2 of Class A misdemeanor possession of marijuana, was sentenced to the Howard County Jail for one year, suspended except for time served

with unsupervised probation. Defendant was further ordered to pay court costs and a drug free community assessment fee.

- Christopher R. Moore, 19, Kokomo, convicted in Howard Superior Court 1 of Class A misdemeanor possession of marijuana, was sentenced to the Howard County Jail for one year, all suspended with credit for time served on supervised probation. Defendant was further ordered to complete and pay for alcohol and drug program, pay court costs, probation fees and a drug free community assessment fee.
- Debra A. Cannon, 43, Kokomo,

convicted in Howard Superior Court 1 of violating terms of her probation, was sentenced to 13 days, the balance of her suspended sentence.

- Ricky Kong, 21, Kokomo, convicted in Howard Superior Court 1 of violating terms of his probation, had a portion of sentence revoked and will serve the balance on supervised probation. Defendant was further ordered to pay probation fees and court costs.
- Jeffrey L. Forrey, 48, Kokomo, convicted in Howard Superior Court 1 of Class A misdemeanor possession of marijuana, was sentenced to the Howard County

Jail for one year suspended except for 30 days executed and given credit for time served. Defendant was placed on supervised probation for 11 months and ordered to complete and pay for drug and alcohol program, courts costs, probation fees and a community drug free assessment fee.

- Aaron Roseberry, 27, Kokomo, convicted in Howard Superior Court 1 of Class B misdemeanor visiting a common nuisance, was sentenced to the Howard County Jail for 180 days, suspended except for time served and will serve one year on unsupervised probation. Defendant was further ordered to complete and pay for alcohol and drug program,

pay probation fees and court costs.

- David J. Goehst, 32, Kokomo, convicted in Howard Circuit Court of violating terms of probation, was sentenced to 48 days of suspended sentence in the Howard County Criminal Justice Center and probation is extended for one year. Defendant was further ordered to pay all fines and fees within one year.
- Henry Michael, 57, Kokomo, convicted in Howard Circuit Court of Class A misdemeanor possession of marijuana, was sentenced to the Howard County Criminal Justice Center of one year with 44 days to be executed and balance suspended with credit for

time served. Defendant was placed on supervised probation for unexecuted balance of sentence and ordered to complete alcohol and drug services program, and pay court costs, drug free community assessment fee and probation fees.

- Dorothy Thomas, 31, Kokomo, convicted in Howard Circuit Court of Class D felony neglect of a dependent, was sentenced to the Indiana Women's Prison for 18 months with two days executed and balance suspended on supervised probation and given credit for time served. Defendant was further ordered to pay court costs and probation fees.
