VUYLSTEKE HOME

Vuylsteke built the house in 1905 while serving as vice counsel for the Netherlands. Queen Wilhelmina of the Netherlands would later name him counsel-general.



POMPEIIAN VILLA

The home was originally built as a winter home at a price of \$50,000 for Isaac Ellwood in 1900, developer of barbed wire. James Hopkins of Diamond Match Co. bought the house in 1901.



WHITE HAVEN

White Haven was built for Dr. and Mrs. H.D. Morris in 1915 while the Intracoastal Canal was being dredged. Morris was a British counsel and a physician. It was sold to the Clarence Booz family who sold it in the mid-1940s to Stella and Carl White.
