A Tribute to Kentucky's Fallen Warriors lost in the War on Terror

Helping to bring this concept to the forefront is the current mission of KAMP (Kentucky Association of Mortgage Professionals) who is coordinating a 1,100 mile motorcycle ride across the Commonwealth of Kentucky to pay tribute to the state's Fallen Warriors who have laid down their lives for their country and their loved ones.

The ultimate goal of KAMP,

and its hundreds of volunteers, in this venture is to provide scholarships for the children of Kentucky's military personnel. This event alone is expected to provide \$40,000 that will be donated to The Enlisted Association of Kentucky for their use in awarding scholarships to eligible students.

This motorcycle ride will take place over a five-day period of time, beginning on July 1 in Richmond. Other stops include London, Bowling Green, Hopkinsville, Paducah, Owensboro, Louisville, Newport, Ashland and Lexington. With a paid registration fee, riders may choose to participate for one day or for the entire ride. Each participant receives an official T-shirt, sew-on patch and arm band. The ride support system will include a maintenance vehicle, luggage team, medical team, designated no-cost fuel stops and free meals.
