▶ INDIANA GRADUATION RATE BREAKDOWN

The 2006-07 graduation rate (Class of 2007) will be the percentage of students who entered Grade 9 in fall 2003 and graduated in four years or less. This is the first publication of this method for calculating graduation rates.

- 76.5 percent of students graduated within four years
- 11.9 percent of students are reported dropouts or undetermined (meaning they either moved out of state or dropped out without formally withdrawing from school)
