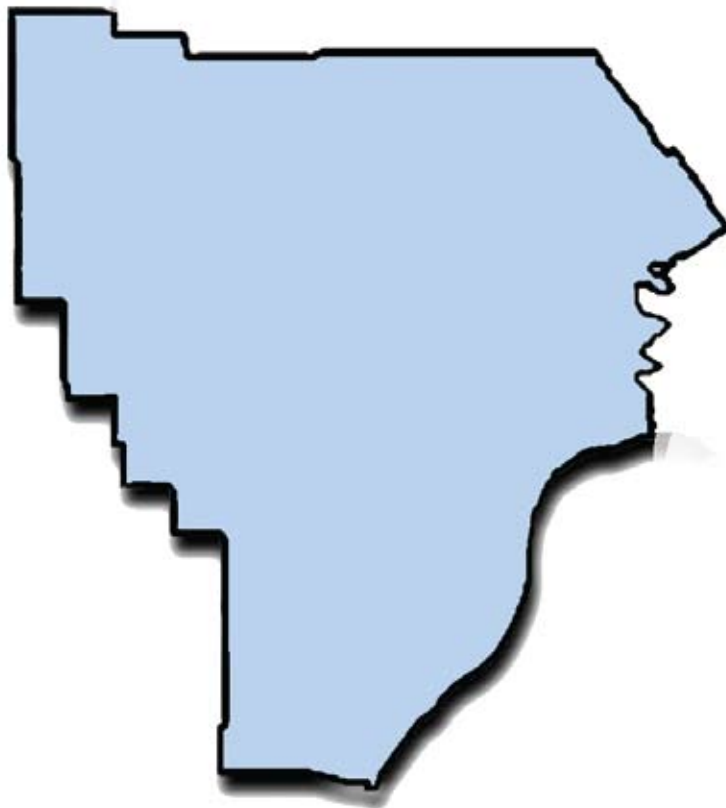

January is the coldest month in Southern Indiana, with an average low of 25 degrees and an average high of 41 degrees. July is the hottest month, with an average high of 87 and an average low of 70.

The average rainfall amount in Floyd and Clark counties is 43-45 inches a year, while the state average ranges from 37-47 inches.

The average amount of snowfall in Southern Indiana is 14 inches, compared to 76 inches in the northern Indiana snow belt region. The average date of the state's first snowfall is Nov. 19; the last snowfall occurs March 30, on average.

► TORNADOES

- While tornado activity in Floyd and Clark counties is slightly below the state average, it is 86 percent greater than the overall United States average.
- Indiana has an average of 23 tornadoes a year; tornadoes have occurred in the state during every month.
