The single best thing to do in San Marcos doesn't cost a cent. The constant 72 degree San Marcos River can counteract the most sweltering summer day; while the water's relative warmth allows for year-round recreation.

Most people enjoy the San Marcos River on tubes rented from the San Marcos Lions Club rental at City Park.

The float goes down to the new Rio Vista Falls, where a shuttle brings tubers back to the starting point. Call 396-LION.
