22) Gasp at Wonder Cave

Located only 1.5 miles from IH-35, the park is open from Memorial Day to Labor Day from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. Thereafter, from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Tours leave every 15 minutes.

Visit the largest petting zoo in Texas, a 130 million-year old cave and a 110 ft. observation tower.

Wonder Cave descends into the Edwards escarpment, giving visitors a first hand view of what an earthquake is all about.

Also visit the anti-gravity room and gift shop. The cave has been open to visitors since 1903.
