Evidence has been discovered by archaeologists indicating mankind has lived in the area around the headwaters of the San Marcos River for some 12,000 years, making it among the oldest continuously inhabited sites in North America. Certain Native American tribes who lived in the Southwest believed what is now under and around Spring Lake to be their "Garden of Eden" in stories handed down through the generations.

The San Marcos Springs, Spring Lake and the San Marcos River are home to a myriad of plants and animals including the San Marcos Salamander, the Fountain Darter, the Texas Blind Salamander and Texas Wild Rice.

Learning more about the unique habitat is one of the benefits of volunteering in the river stewardship project, a program of the San Marcos Parks and Recreation Department that performs functions ranging from habitat management and routine maintenance to scientific research on the San Marcos River.
